

HOW TO APPLY

- 1) Find the scholarship description & application.
- 2) Examine the criteria and determine if you meet the minimum eligibility.



- 3) Obtain a copy of your transcripts from the school office.
- 4) Track your participation and volunteering for after-school and summer clubs and activities.
- 5) Begin the application process.

Many places such as Scholarships, Inc. and the Greater Green Bay Community Foundation have one application that works for dozens of scholarships.

MYTHS ABOUT SCHOLARSHIPS



ONLY THE ATHLETES GET SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships are available to people with varying backgrounds and interests including agriculture, math, parks, lesser-known sports such as bowling, or other career or extracurricular interests.

ONLY THE SMARTEST STUDENTS GET SCHOLARSHIPS

Many scholarships don't have a GPA requirement. Many provide funds to students with financial hardships. Other scholarships look for a specific career interest, core values, life skills, or students struggling through school, but who are hard-working.

YOU HAVE TO KNOW THE RIGHT PEOPLE TO GET A SCHOLARSHIP

Applications are reviewed by committees that evaluate each application based on the eligibility & criteria outlined in the scholarship description.

SHARE HOW YOU FIT THE CRITERIA

Scholarship applications will ask for information such as your high school classes, clubs, jobs, volunteering and other extracurricular activities. Essay questions are used get to know you personally and how you fit the additional criteria for the scholarship.
